What role does the church play in this mission?

In what ways can you support the divine calling of the church?
4. Although the message of the church is good news, many do not respond positively to it. Why do you think that is the case?
5. In what ways has this chapter altered your perspective on your personal identity and value?
6. In what ways is the current-day church representing Christ well?
